


Independent DIY media projects are spreading around the planet at unprecedented speed. Triggered by discontent with the mainstream media and supported by the widespread availability of media technologies, groups all over the world are creating their own channels of information and distribution in order to bypass the (mainstream) corporate media.

The idea behind most of these projects is to create open platforms to which everyone can contribute - not only a small media elite with their particular interests. By eliminating the classic division between professional producers and passive audience, many issues and discussions that were previously suppressed become visible and available.

What is Indymedia?



Indymedia is a democratic media outlet for the creation of radical, accurate, and passionate tellings of truth. There are currently over one hundred and fifty Independent Media Centers around the world. Should I believe news I read on Indymedia?

Should you believe news you read on the BBC or CNN.com? All reporters have their own biases; governments and massive for-profit corporations that own media entities have their own biases as well, and often impose their views on their reporters (or their reporters self-censor to conform their own biases to those of their employer).

You should look at all reports you read on the Indymedia site with a critical eye, just as you should look at all media before you in a discerning and critical manner.

Will you post my article/story/etc.?

We want to hear your stories and those of your community. The issues of concern, local, national and international.

Nottinghamshire Independent Media Centre, is part of IMC / Indymedia UK. It is an open-publishing platform for news, issues, actions and analysis reporting on grassroots, non-cor-

porate, non-commercial social justice, environmental and political issues. It is maintained by a network of media activists and groups. IMC stands for Independent media centre, UK stands for United Kollektives.

IMC UK is dedicated to the open publishing ethos. IMC UK volunteers moderate the site [see our mission statement] and collaborate in the production of features. Contents on the newswire and calendar are generated by anyone who wants to contribute.

In the interests of the integrity and readability of the site, we operate within some 'editorial guidelines'. For example we are against discrimination: posts using language, imagery, or other forms of communication promoting racism, fascism, xenophobia, sexism and homophobia. In fact, any other form of discrimination, would be removed. Further, advertising posts for personal or product promotions are discouraged. Likewise, those posts that are inaccurate or misleading.








What are Indymedia's long-term goals?

That's a big question, one that every Indymedia organizer would likely answer in a different way. Indymedia endeavors to empower people to become the media by present honest, accurate, powerful independent reports.

One vague long-term goal would be to foster and facilitate the development of as much independent media as possible around the world. Some come to their Indymedia organizing with a deeper goal, to enable people, while they're "becoming the media," to realize they can take control of other aspects of their lives that they previously left up to 'experts' or 'professionals.'

On a practical level, some who are involved with Indymedia are working toward the development of national and/or international television or radio networks, and others are working toward the establishment of an international independent regular newspaper and others projects that will assure the public has access to independent news reports.



Are you "activists" or "journalists"?

Some would say "activists," some would say "journalists," some would say both. Each Indymedia reporter/ organizer must make this distinction for him/herself. Having a point of view does not preclude Indymedia reporters from delivering truthful, accurate, honest news. Most, if not all, local IMCs, have explicit policies to strongly deter reporters from participating in direct actions while reporting for Indymedia. In general, on the occasions of political rallies, political activists associate who at all with Indymedia.org always choose nonviolent civil disobedience to highlight the absurdities in certain policies of corporations or governments.





"Independent" Media ??

No corporation owns Indymedia, no government manages the organization, no single donor finances the project. Indymedia is not the mouthpiece of any political party or organization. People involved with Indymedia have a wide variety of political and personal viewpoints. Anyone may participate in Indymedia organizing and anyone may post to the Indymedia newswires. Political parties or organizations may choose to publish articles on the Indymedia newswires, but in doing so they invite public debate about their positions from any reader of the site; any reader may respond by publishing his/her comments alongside the post in question. True, many Indymedia organizers and people who post to the sites have political opinions that fall along the left side of the political spectrum, yet each individual chooses his/her own level of involvement

Central to the Nottinghamshire IMC is the Nottinghamshire Indymedia website, which as a platform generates a variety of other activities including a community radio project, training sessions and workshops, video-productions, info nights, film-screenings and a regularly print out of the generated news.
